## Education; the basic development

This Newsletter is *Dedicated to our honorable employee Hammeed Ali (Household Interviewer) who lost his life in a road accident during duty hours*

### BEFARe mourned over the sad death of its employee

30 years old Hameed Ali had been employed in BEFARe/PPV project as HHI (House Hold Interviewer). On his way for the training he faced an accident in CHAKWAL and was injured, he was taken to the hospital he could not survive of his injuries and passed away in District Hospital Chakwal. Chief Executive along with FC Islamabad visited Hameed Ali's residence in Rawalpindi for condolence and met his elder brother who later shown late Hameed's kitchen garden which he decorated himself, Hameed was very fond of his garden. Later Chief Executive along with FC Islamabad BEAFRe/ PPV visited Fauji Foundation hospital to meet injured staff members who were badly injured during the accident.

### BEFARe installs 12 solar water pumps in lower Dir under RAHA initiative.

BEFARe under RAHA initiative has been awarded a project W-30 " Alternate Energy Sources for Clean Drinking Water and Improved Living with the support of KFW through UNHCR. The project embarks upon two components.

1. Installing 12 solar water pumps in 4 UCs of lower Dir.
2. Conducting 24 health and hygiene sessions for

the constitutes 12 Management committees.

BEFARe in August 2011 signed an MoU with EBR Energy Pakistan Pvt (Ltd) for the provision and installation of the solar water pumps on the identified sites.

BEFARe and EBR teams conducted a visit to the identified sites for engineering assessments and interaction with the benefiting communities.

### BEFARe enters into an Eight months teachers training project with BPRM (Bureau of Population, Refugees and Migration-US Department of State)

BEFARe with the support of BPRM is carrying out an eight months project in 52 AR Camps in KPK to complement its COPE project supported by UNHCR( Providing educational facilities to more than 54,000 children) The project emphasizes on improving the quality of education in BEFARe schools and enhancing capacity of teachers through providing in service training to 350

teachers in pedagogy and subject matter

The project is also embarking upon providing training to 200 Head teachers and S. teachers in school management and community mobilization techniques for improved management and community participation The capacity building of teachers will benefit them in accessing competitive jobs in Afghanistan in case of repatriation.

The project team in August 2011 was oriented on the project envisaged objectives and activities and their respective roles were assigned to them.

### BEFARe distributes NFIs to the flood affected families in Sind.

BEFARe in a consortium with International Medical Corps (IMC) is carrying out a project on the provision of comprehensive primary healthcare services, including hygiene education and distribution of hygiene related NFIs to the flood affected population for an immediate response in 2 districts of Sind.; namely Dadu and Thatta The project has been funded by OFDA. BEFARe is responsible for the distribution and replenishment of hygiene kits and jerry cans for storage of clean drinking water. BEFARe is also responsible for conducting hygiene promotion sessions separately for male and female through hygiene promoters (HPs) at the identified four districts. August 2011 was the concluding month of the project. The team in August distributed 5,910 Hygiene kits and 23,640 Jerry Cans in the identified UCs of Thatta and Dadu. The teams have already conducted .HP sessions with the registered beneficiaries of NFIs.

### BEFARe is providing educational services to more than 53,000 children through its 129 administered schools under COPE Project.

BEFARe is implementing the largest refugee education project worldwide with the support of UNCHR in 52 Afghan refugee camps in KP since 1996. The program is currently supporting 53,000 Afghan refugee children enrolled in 129 schools.

BEFARe in August 2011 continued to provide educational services to the enrolled children in its administered schools.

### BEFARe attends ToT at Islamabad

BEFARe with the support of The Asia Foundation (TAF) under the Free And Fair Election Network (FAFEN)

In August 2011, two training workshops were organized by TAF and FAFEN in Islamabad (1) Program Manager review and planning meeting and (2) Financial training

FAFEN online program tracker was developed and the concerned staff was trained on online reporting. Field staff review and planning meeting was also conducted at BEFARe Sub Office Attock in which Governance Monitoring and Advocacy plans for the constituencies and district were prepared and finalized.
